Dear Lisa, I enjoyed coming to today's class, staying for an hour and seeing the individual student presentations. You began by inviting the students into the learning space and engaged them in breath work. I appreciated you giving an overview of the class before starting the presentations. You offer a respectful and comfortable learning space. I appreciated how you reinforced the importance of respect and brave spaces. You also created a circle format for the class that also reinforces equal voices and presence. Your caring rapport with the students was evident.

After each student presentation, you opened up to the class for comments before you responded. This was important as it shows how much student voice is valued in the learning environment. I was also taken by how open the students were in sharing personal experiences and the depth of reflection by some of the students. Since this is the second last in person class, it was evident that is a result of the community building that has taken place throughout the term. It also reflects the level the students are at and their confidence as they enter their last year in the program. It was most meaningful to hear the narratives reflecting on their last three years and connect to this year's placement.

Your responses to each student reflected the following-

- Your ability to pose probing questions pushed the thinking further. This drew out a few students who needed to go deeper in their presentation narratives. This also demonstrates your knowledge at many levels connected to placement and teaching pedagogies.
- You referred back to course content from previous sessions
- You spoke to the importance of advocacy and used your theoretical knowledge and experiences in opening up the discussion and drawing on the comments from several students.
- You brought the conversation back to the importance of the child at the centre, the child as a competent being, which is so important
- I particularly liked how you spoke about "intention" in terms of structures, challenges, philosophical stances.
- It was very clear that many of the students who presented had stepped out of their comfort zones and were reflexive.

Question- You did go over the process for the presentations, which helped frame the class. I was wondering if they all were presenting in this session or just a certain number.

F. STRENGTHS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

Lisa, you bring such strength to working with fourth year students and synthesizing 4 years of placement and probing to enhance deep critical reflection. You offer a caring environment and one word comes to mind... Kindness.

Your theoretical and pedagogical knowledge is evident and you comfortably draw on this and your own experiences. Many of your strengths and teaching attributes are discussed in the previous section.

One minor suggestion would be to put on the white board or a slide, who was presenting that day as presentations are spanning two classes. Perhaps an agenda to outline the class in a slide. I was not sure if you post an agenda when using presentation slides.
