This is my second year as a Faculty Advisor in the Early Childhood Studies BA program at Toronto Metropolitan University. I am currently A PhD student in the Faculty of Education at York University. I have completed my course work and am writing my dissertation proposal this summer (2022). I aim to defend my proposal in the fall of 2022 and begin my research. My research addresses the lives of early childhood educators at the intersection of pedagogy and policy, disrupting neoliberal and developmental temporalities that shape ECEs and their work and seeking to create possibilities for ECEs to have time to think. As a PhD student at York I have also held a Teaching Assistantship for the past two years in the BEd. Program under the leadership of the Course Director Dr. Lisa Farley. The course is EDFE 2000 Foundation of Education: Theory into Practice. It is a year long course that examines education through three modules: history, sociology and philosophy. Each module centres Black, Indigenous and Queer scholars that create conditions for students to think critically about education. I also held the position of Treasurer on the York Graduates Students in Education student council this year and was an active participant in the graduate conference committee and the graduate journal committee. I presented at this conference with a colleague and we will be submitting a paper based on our presentation to the journal. I also took a collaborative lead in a newly formed committee that addressed issues of equity and communication within the YGSE and the greater student body. I plan to continue this work next

year as well. I am also a part time professor in the ECE diploma program at George Brown College. This year I have taught Interpersonal Communication, Social Policy as well as Field Placement Seminar courses and a bridging course into the Early Childhood Leadership Degree program. Along side my teaching and studies I lead an activist community, the Early Years Professional RISE UP T.O., affiliated with the Association of Early Childhood Educators Ontario (AECEO). This is a collective community that supports each other and builds and strengthens our political capacities and voices in the fight for Professional Pay and Decent Work. I have given two guest lectures this year. One for Dr. Warren Crichlow and one for Professor Erin Harvey (University of Nova Scotia). I have one publication currently in press with Contemporary Issues in Early Childhood. This publication written with Dr. Kimberly Bezaire argues for more subjectivity within curriculum and field placement courses ECE pre-service programs. I will also be presenting at the Canadian Association for Research in Early Childhood Post-Conference later this month and have just given my first keynote address with two colleagues Dr. Brooke Richardson and Alana Powell at the ECEBC conference.
